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Stokes County Agricultural Fair History

The first Stokes County Agricultural Fair was held at the Tabernacle in King during 1906, according to the records of local historian, Robert Carroll.

The Tabernacle was a round building, located south of Merritt Plumbing and across from the present King City Hall.

In 1907, the fair was held along Mountainview Road where O.O. Grabs Jr.'s home is presently located. The fair continued to exist at this location until 1923.

Robert Carroll has fond memories of this fair, and I recall my aunt, Manie Sizemore, relating that she won ribbons and also worked with the exhibits. More, relating that she won ribbons and also worked with the exhibits.

The American Legion Auxiliary records show that there was a small-scale fair in 1948 and 1949. The exhibits were in a tent on the Legion parking lot.

Ruth Kiser and C.R. Moser Jr. recalled that there was a bad cloud one night, and a tent blew down after the crowd had left. Annie Kate Trawick and I, both Auxiliary charter members, recall the Auxiliary concession under a small tent where we cooked on an oil stove. We remember taggles were everywhere including hanging from our eye lashes.

In 1950, the American Legion had obtained a charter for the Stokes County Agricultural Fair. Gilbert J. Moser helped organize this year and served as president the first two years.

When he retired from Gentry and Moser in 1960, he again served as president for 12 consecutive years. Also, Gilbert J. Moser was president in 1979 and 1980. For six years, he was listed as "Honorary Fair Manager" until his death in December of 1986.

William H. Gentry was president from 1952 until 1960, the term "President" was changed to "Manager" in 1973, and N.C. Hooker was manager from 1973 to 1978. In 1981, Junior Booth was manager. From 1982 until 2003, Dean Hartgrove has been the manager, except for the years 1988-1989 in which Hobson Petree was manager.

The secretaries and treasurers of the Stokes County Agricultural Fair have been: 1951, Forest H. Harmon, secretary; 13 years, Glenn Ashburn served as secretary and treasurer; 1965, Glenn Ashburn, secretary and Dempsey Lily, treasurer; 1966 and 1967, Glenn Ashburn and Allen White, treasurer, 1968 and 1969, Glenn Ashburn, accountant and Dean Hartgrove secretary and treasurer. Dean Hartgrove served as secretary and treasurer for nine years. In 1979, Author Smith was secretary and treasurer. The treasurer for 1980 and 1981 was Author Smith, and in 1982, Kyle Mabe took over the position. Ralph became the treasurer in 1983 and continues to hold that position.

Vice-presidents or assistants to presidents or managers at various times were: G.J. Moser, N.C. Hooker, Dean Hartgrove, Jim Jones, Reggie Spainhour,

Robert Southern, Dempsey Lilly, Arthur Smith, Gene Pratt, Junior Booth, Allen White, Crawford Shouse and Grady Martin.

Mrs. C.V. Kiser (Ruth) served as chairman of the Women's Department, which is now the nine departments on the first floor of the Legion building. For 17 years, Estelle Underwood was co-chairman with Mrs. Kiser. For three years, Estelle Underwood and Kathleen Mendenhall were co-chairmen. For the past 29 years, Kathleen Mendenhall has managed these nine departments.

The first section of the Legion building (approximately 40 feet by 30 feet) was built in 1946. Two wings were constructed later, and many additions were also built.

In 1950, construction was started on the first barn. The new barn was dedicated on March 21, 1996. These barns have been used for horse shows as well as livestock entries and poultry entries at the fair. The barns have served during other functions as well.

Fair officials made many efforts to get rid of the "girlie" show. They had bad publicity because of it, and finally, in 1987, the "girlie" show was eliminated.

The biggest fair attraction during the 1970s was a wrestling gorilla. People came from other states to view this attraction.

One year during the 1970s, the carnival failed to show up. A few rides were obtained by a booking agent, and the event was fairly successful after all.

During the night of the 1981 fair, there was such a downpour of rain that water ran through the barn. Someone called Dempsey Lilly, and he and some other members rescued the animals. The water was so deep that pigs were swimming. Mr. and Mrs. Stine (now deceased) of Stine's Amusements provided Midway events and rides in previous years for our fair.

We have worked with many carnivals, but consider B&K Carnival Company one of the best. As in years past, this year's fair has hot dogs, cotton candy, exhibits of baked goods, canned foods, home furnishings, sewing, fine arts, crafts, flowers, two youth divisions, horticulture, bees, honey, tobacco and school exhibits. Many animals will be exhibited including livestock, poultry, pigeons and rabbits.

The success of the Stokes County Agricultural Fair has been a combined effort of the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary members working with the Stokes County Cooperative Extension Office, King Fire Department, King Police Department, Stokes County Sheriff's Department, exhibitors in Stokes and folks from the adjoining counties. Thousands of volunteers also work during fair week.

Stokes County Agricultural Fair History-continued

2000: Smokey Mountain Amusements began providing our midway events and rides.

2001: On Tuesday morning, September 11, 2001, before the judging began, Don Adams called all the workers together and told us the tragic news in New York. He led us in prayer for everyone concerned. A black cloud hung over the building all week.

2003: Don Adams became the fair manager with Dean Hartgrove, Pete Epperson and Jack Warren as the assistant managers. Dean served as fair manager from 1982 to 1987, and again 1990 to 2002.

2005: Ralph Hartgrove served as treasurer from 1982 until 2005.

2006: Ron Shouse became treasurer with Danny Bowen serving as assistant treasurer.

2008: Ron Shouse served as Treasurer from 2006 to 2007, C.A. Hunsucker became treasurer with Danny Bowen as his assistant in 2008.

2009: Danny Bowen served as assistant treasurer until his passing on October 21, and that same year, we won the Image Award from the NC Department of Agricultural Fairs.

2010: Joyce Wall became secretary with Peggy Wall as assistant. Kathleen Mendenhall became a department adviser after serving as secretary from 1980 until 2009.

2011: We won the State Agricultural Fair Award for our division.

2012: Billy Helsabeck retired as chairperson of Horticulture. Billy served as chairperson in this department for many years. Harvey Boyles replaced Billy as the chairperson. We lost Rupert Hall and Dempsey Lilly. They had been involved with the fair for over 50 years. Rupert had served as the ticket chairman and Dempsey had served as midway chairman.

2013: We began judging all the "Best of Show" winners for Youths and Adults for competition with other "Best of Show" winners thought North Carolina at the NC State Fair. On December 8, Dean Hartgrove passed away. Dean had served on the Stokes County Fair Committee for many years. He held many positions on the board including serving as manager of the Stokes County Agriculture Fair for 21 years.

2014: On Saturday, September 13th we held our first Fried Apple Pie Contest.

2015: On July 3, 2015, Kathleen Mendenhall passed away. She served as secretary from 1980 until 2009 and managed the nine departments on the first floor of the Legion Building for many years.

2016: Rachel Brown, a senior at South Stokes High School, member of the FFA and a youth member of the fair committee, received a \$1,000.00 scholarship from the N.C. State Fair Association. Rachel is the first person from Stokes County to receive this scholarship. On Friday night, wrestling in Barn was held for the 1st time.

2017: On Friday night the American Legion Post 290 Honor Guard preformed a touching memorial service to recognize veterans.

2018: Old McNally's Pig Racing returned for the 5th year. Due to Hurricane Florence the Fair had to shut down on Thursday night. All activities scheduled for Friday and Saturday were cancelled.

2020: Due to the Covid-19 virus, the Fair was canceled.

2021: Due to the Covid-19 virus, exhibits were not allowed for departments A-HB. Displays were made of items from the departments. Horticulture & Field Crops and Bees & Honey were allowed to accept items to be judged. Scouts, 4-H, and FFA groups were allowed to set up booths in the basement. Livestock shows, Poultry, Rabbits & Pigeons were allowed to be in the barn and judged. The weather and attendance were great. Joyce Wall resigned as Secretary in November. Joyce served as Secretary from 2010 to 2021. Prior to serving as secretary, Joyce assisted in various roles and assisted Kathleen Mendenhall with tallying premiums for Depts A-H. The Advisory Board, Chairpersons, and Department Committees appreciate Joyce for her hard work and dedication to the Fair during her many years of service.

2022: The Fair fully opened for the first time since 2019! We had perfect weather and recorded our third best attendance since 2002. Don Adams resigned as Fair Manager in October; Ron Thorpe became the new Fair Manager. Don agreed to stay on as an Advisor. The Advisory Board, Chairpersons, and Department Committees appreciate all of Don's hard work and dedication to the Fair during his 19 years as Fair Manager.

2023: We recorded our 2nd highest attendance since 2003! Rachel Caudle's Youth Best of Show entry was submitted to the NC State Fair and won Best of Show at the State.

2024: We recorded our 2nd highest attendance ever! On April 9, 2025, Don Adams passed away. Don served as Fair Manager from 2003 until 2022 and remained an Advisor through the 2024 fair. The Fair Board extends our sincere condolences to his family and friends.

2025: The Fair saw increased attendance and the addition of more vendor spaces, reflecting continued growth and community support. In competitive exhibits, Reece Whitman's dragon entry in the youth division was selected to advance to the North Carolina State Fair Best of Show competition, along with Pat Bradley's Pilot Mountain quilt in the adult division. Pat Bradley's quilt went on to win Best of Show at the state level, marking a significant achievement for the fair and its exhibitors. This year also brought exciting updates to livestock events with the addition of the Foothills Showman Circuit to the youth livestock competitions. In addition, Clover was implemented to allow the fair to accept debit and credit card payments, helping improve convenience for attendees, vendors, and participants.

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General Rules

For Stokes and adjoining counties or natives of these counties. The management of the Stokes County Agriculture Fair reserves the right to rule on all questions not covered by these rules.

The following are rules and regulations governing entries, exhibits and awards:

Rule #1: ONLY VERIFIED CERTIFIED SERVICE ANIMALS OR ANIMALS USED IN APPROVED EVENTS ARE ALLOWED ON THE AMERICAN LEGION POST 290 PROPERTY. SERVICE ANIMALS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED INTO ENENTS WHERE ANIMALS ARE PERFORMING IN APPROVED EVENTS.

Rule #2: Fair Management will use every possible means to protect property, but Management WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARS OR PARTS OF CARS OR ARTICLES LEFT IN CARS.

Rule #3: No distribution of handbills or other advertisements will be permitted. No peddling, hawking, or begging will be permitted without permission from the Management.

Rule #4: All exhibits/entries must be in place by MONDAY night unless otherwise directed for a particular class. Exhibits must be brought to The American Legion building between 9 AM to 7 PM.

Rule #5: The Management will use diligence to ensure the safety of livestock and articles entered for exhibit or display after their arrival on the grounds, but under no circumstances will it be responsible for loss, injury, theft or damage by fire, lightning, wind or any other agency to such livestock or articles on exhibit display.

Rule #6: "Any and all articles, obnoxious or repulsive in character, or offensive in any way, will be forbidden, or if entered without being fully known, shall be removed at once."

Rule #7: When entering an item made by another person, have the other person give permission to put item in Fair. The person who makes the item must receive the premium, even if the item is now owned by you.

Rule #8: Any person entering Departments G and I is allowed to exhibit one each of the articles on which a premium is offered, but two exhibits from one individual in the same class is prohibited. Livestock exempt.

Rule #9: All exhibits in Department G and I are to be grown on the exhibitor's farm or garden during the current year and not a single produce obtained elsewhere. For Department G: Indicate proper item number prior to entry.

Rule #10: Spoiled or deteriorated articles will be removed from display.

Rule #11: Special needs entries will be accepted.

Rule #12: Notice rules under "Baked Products" regarding cakes and cake sales at 7 PM on Tuesday.

General Rules-continued

Rule #13: Entries in Departments A-H are for NON-PROFESSIONAL ONLY except where designated.

Rule #14: All exhibits must remain in place until Sunday at 1:30 PM or premium will be void. It is necessary to show the registration card. (Exception: Livestock - which must remain until 8:30 PM)

Rule #15: Exhibitors may claim their exhibits and/or premiums from 1:30 PM to 4 PM Sunday and from 8 AM to 5 PM Monday. Exhibitors should claim exhibits and/or premiums from the superintendent of the department in which the articles are exhibited; otherwise, the Management will dispose of them as seems most convenient. All premiums will be paid during the hours named above. Premiums not claimed in 30 days will be forfeited and item(s) will be disposed of.

Rule #16: Judges will award prizes according to merit, regardless of competition. In Departments A-H, only one first, one second, and one third place ribbon may be awarded per category.

Rule #17: All judges will be instructed to disqualify articles not meeting department rules.

Rule #18: Decision of the judges will be final.

Rule #19: Those in charge of departments or assistants will accompany the judges when making awards in their respective departments and furnish them with desired information.

Rule #20: State law requires that poultry undergo a State Inspection before entering any exhibit. Poultry, rabbits, and chickens will be accepted on Monday, 4 PM to 7 PM. See rules under Department P for Poultry. The inspection fee will be paid by the fair.

Rule #21: All livestock on exhibit must be cared for by the exhibitor. Each exhibitor is expected to furnish their own feeding and watering equipment, except for poultry and rabbits.

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RULES FOR CAKES

CAKE SALE: All cakes, including Best of Show, will be auctioned to the highest bidder on Tuesday, September 15 at 7 PM. Auction will be held at Legion Building. Only one piece of any cake will be left on display, and one piece will have been cut from the cake for judging. Money derived from this auction will be paid to the exhibitor. Cakes will not be sold if judges have disqualified. Youth cakes will be sold first.

If Cake is not sold, participants may pick up cakes after 3 PM Tuesday; otherwise, cakes will be auctioned. No cakes made from cake mixes will be accepted. No bakery cakes will be accepted. No cakes that need refrigeration will be accepted (this includes those with icing containing cream cheese, whipped cream, pineapple, banana, or fresh coconut.) Icings with eggs must be cooked.

Good Qualities-Appearance: pleasing appearance, slightly rounded top, unfrosted: smooth, uniform, light brown, frosted: frosting free from crystals or crustiness. frosting free from crystals or crustiness.

Good Qualities-Texture: fine even grain, thin cell walls, feathery light, crumbly when cut.

Good Qualities-Crumb: smooth and velvety, slightly moist, light and tender, pleasing color.

Good Qualities-Flavor: delicate, well-blended flavor, sweet flavor, free from strong flavor, tastes good.

Poor Qualities-Appearance: not pleasing in appearance, peaked or sunken top cracked, sugary or coarse crust, too sticky, too dry or too coarse frosting, pale or too brown crust stickiness, or crustiness.

Poor Qualities-Texture: thick cell walls, coarse or uneven grain, tunnels or large holes, heavy.

Poor Qualities-Crumb: soggy or sad, harsh or dry, tough, off color.

Poor Qualities-Flavor: bitter, flat, strong flavor of egg, flavoring or other ingredients, unpleasant flavor.

Cakes should be placed on a cake round no larger than 10". 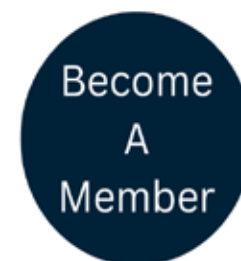

Rule #2	Any BEEKEEPING items or products may be used to reinforce the theme of the display; however, the major content of the display must be unmistakably the result of the junior entrant's efforts.
Rule #3	Adult advice and assistance are encouraged; however, this is a Junior display and will be judged on the entrant's individual effort. Any display that obviously does not reflect work of the entrant will be disqualified.

General Rules for all Species

There will be NO substitutions, changes, or additions after the entry deadline.

All exhibitors are limited to ONE animal per class, except where classes are broken by weight.

All shows are limited to 2 head per exhibitor for breeding and two head for market (except swine, which will be limited to market).

All animals should be dry at weigh-in (it is suggested to weigh BEFORE you wash).

There will be no sexually intact livestock allowed on the grounds (bulls, boars, bucks, or rams).

All animals must have an ear tag (or ear notch for swine).

An official scrapie tag is required for sheep and goats.

All animals should be less than two years of age as of the day of the show.

All shows are open to the following NC counties: Stokes, Forsyth, Surry, Yadkin, Guilford, and Rockingham counties. Patrick and Henry Counties in VA. You must be a full-time resident in these NC & VA counties.

Livestock chairs reserve the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and arbitrarily determine and settle all matters.

NO animals may arrive before check-in times, as animals must be inspected at unloading.

NO animals may leave prior to 8:30 PM



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Entries

Entries must be submitted electronically via the proper form at <https://go.ncsu.edu/stokesagfairlivestock> by September 1st.

All youth exhibitors' ages are determined by their age as of January 1 of the current year.

Health Regulations

All livestock must conform to the current guidelines for Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and health requirements at the time of the fair.

Health regulations will be strictly enforced, and decisions of the regulatory veterinarian concerning animal health status are final.

No animals may be unloaded on the fairgrounds before being checked and approved by a vet on site.

All out-of-state livestock exhibitors must have health certificates and the required tests.

See entry requirements for each species.

All species must follow specific entry requirements listed under each class's rules and regulations.

All entries shall be inspected at unloading.

Any and all animals not meeting the entry requirements and/or exhibiting any signs of disease or illness may be refused entry, required to be isolated, and/or required to be returned to the farm of origin.

SHOWMANSHIP

Showmanship classes are based on the age of the exhibitor as of Jan. 1 of the current year.

Super Senior: any youth 19-21 years old

Gifted: (any age individual with special needs, difficulties or handicaps.)

Rule #1	All birds and rabbits are entered at the risk of the owners. The fair shall not be responsible for loss, injury, theft, damage by lightning, wind, fire or any other agency, but will exercise all possible vigilance in the care of the exhibits at the exhibit barn.
Rule #2	The management will reserve the right to coop one or more birds or rabbits of the same variety and belonging to the same person together if absolutely necessary. In no case will two male birds be placed in the same coop.
Rule #3	Premiums will be paid only to worthy specimens. No sick birds or rabbits will be accepted.
Rule #4	No one will be allowed to handle birds or rabbits on display, except owners, or officials of the show, without permission of the directors.
Rule #5	Exhibits must be picked up on Saturday, September 19 from 12 PM until 4 PM
Rule #6	All poultry must be presented for examination before being placed in the show. Only birds in apparent good health will be accepted. Those developing signs of infectious or communicable diseases during the show will be placed in isolation and shall not be removed for the purpose of exhibition.
Rule #7	Due to the availability of a State Inspector, Poultry and Rabbits will be accepted on Monday, September 14 from 4 PM - 8 PM Inspection fee will be paid by Stokes County Fair.
Rule #8	Since we do not have open competition for rabbits, we are allowing any junior between the ages of 8 to 18 years, residence of Stokes County and active in a youth organization to exhibit his animals at no charge.
Rule #9	All birds and rabbits will be fed and cared for by the Stokes County Fair.
Rule #10	Judging Tuesday, September 15. No one allowed in area 6 PM - 8 PM
Rule #11	Right reserved by the fair committee to refuse all entries after available space is filled.

Rule #12	Due to space limitations and to aid the judges, pre-entry is required. Entries will be accepted until all available space is filled. Entries must be received by September 1. Entries should be made on the following form.
Rule #13	Each exhibitor will be limited to 20 entries.
Rule #14	For poultry and rabbits there will be an entry fee of \$1 per entry.
